#### **General objective**

Improving the quality of education at Palestinian schools in the southern and middle of the country;

Jerusalem, Bethlehem and North Hebron directorates



#### **Specific Objectives**

- 1. Development of the physical infrastructure of the teacher's resource center building.
- 2. Strengthening a collaborative network structure among educational stakeholders in the southern and middle West Bank, including Jerusalem.
- 3. Improving the teaching/learning qualities of Palestinian educators from 50 schools in the directorates of Jerusalem, Bethlehem and North Hebron in:
  - a) Special needs education
  - b) Technology and media in education
  - c) Pedagogy
  - d) Various practical educational skills
- 4. Providing permanent resources and expertise for teachers, schools and students.
- 5. Providing opportunities for local and international exchanges between teachers, and students.
- 6. Supporting education for gender equity, human rights, democracy, cultural identity and diversity, and environmental protection.
- 7. Enhancing the capacity of BU for providing teacher training and support, and managing the project.

#### **Expected Outcomes**

- Children are more active in the learning process
- The teachers of primary and secondary education are more confident and creative using new working methods in the classroom
- Increased the number of teachers with a teaching qualification recognized by the
- 700 educators have received training certificates in different areas of expertise
- The teachers will be able to create new materials with the resources available in their schools
- Increase by 50% the use of assessment options to measure the skills of analysis and expression of students against the use of traditional tests of stored knowledge
- The primary and secondary teachers have incorporated the use of "research" as a tool for developing their own teaching practices
- 200 teachers have participated in courses on new technologies and their use in different academic fields



#### **Expected Outcomes**

- At least 80% of teachers participating in training activities have been incorporating new technologies into their teaching plan
- 400 teachers and principals have participated in specific training courses
- The schools participating in the program carry out appropriate educational diagnoses of children with learning difficulties
- Parents of students with special educational needs are more involved in the processes of learning and development of children
- Children with special educational needs enrolled in participating schools are more motivated in their studies and better integrated in the centers



#### **Expected Outcomes**

- 100 teachers from 50 participating institutions have been selected as agents of change within schools and communities to which they belong
- Children participate in the activities of mentoring and monitoring "Big Brother", "Big Sister"
- At least 10 local organizations contribute their experience to the program
- Children participating in the tutoring program and monitoring are more confident and motivated in school



#### **Activities**

- Development and implementation of the certification program for teachers in service without a qualification diploma recognized by the Ministry of Education and Higher Education
- 6000 hours of academic supervision at the schools.
- Workshops on pedagogy and teaching methodologies
- practical lessons in the use of new technologies with students from participating schools are performed
- The minimum necessary material and equipment to incorporate new technologies into educational process are distributed among the 50 schools
- Practical activities with teachers and students in the use of new teaching methodologies to promote the progress of children with special educational needs are completed
- Learning packages are produced with materials for use by teachers (diagnostic tools, a true tool for searching, new support materials, etc.).



#### **Activities**

- Campaigns to promote the awareness regarding children's with special needs.
- Documentary video about the real issues faced by special needs students, teachers and parents
- A study is published on pupils with special educational needs carried out in 50 schools (the study will be conducted during the first two years.
- To develop Special Education academic program at Bethlehem University.
- Summer Educational Camps
- The monitoring and mentoring program Big Brother-Big Sister.
- The "Golden Teachers" program
